Turnout (ballet) Turnout is measured in terms of the angle between the center In ballet, turnout (also turn-out) is rotation of the leg at the hips which causes the feet (and knees) to turn outward, away from the front of the body. raising it to the side and rear. This rotation allows for greater extension of the leg, especially when raising it to the side and rear. Turnout is an essential part of classical ballet technique. Positions of the feet in ballet There are five basic positions in modern-day classical ballet, known as the first through fifth positions. In 1725, dancing master Pierre Rameau credited the codification of these five positions to choreographer Pierre Beauchamp. Neoclassical ballet It draws on the advanced technique of 19th-century Russian Imperial dance, but strips it of its detailed narrative and heavy theatrical setting while retaining many key techniques, such as pointe technique. The term "neoclassical ballet" appears in the 1920s with Sergei Diaghilev's Ballets Russes, in response to the excesses of romanticism and post-romantic modernism. Upon his graduation, Balanchine Neoclassical ballet is the style of 20th-century classical ballet exemplified by the works of George Balanchine. student at the famed Imperial Ballet School, which was (and remains) steadfast in its firm commitment to classical ballet technique 215b9b8a35

Many of the stylistic variations are associated with specific training methods that have been named after their originators. Many of its attributes come from the ideas and innovations of 20th-century modern dance, including floor work and turn-in of the legs. The style also contains many movements emphasizing the body's flexibility

British ballet The identifying characteristic of British ballet is the focus on clean, precise technique and purity of line that is free of exaggeration and mannerisms. The main difference between the two is that The Royal Ballet School trains professional dancers, the Royal Academy of Dance trains teachers. British ballet methods operate on the principle that establishing correct technique and strength slowly makes it much easier for the student to adapt to more difficult vocabulary and techniques later on. The identifying characteristic of British ballet is the focus on clean, precise technique and purity of line that is free of exaggeration and British ballet is most recognised for two leading methods, those of the Royal Ballet School and the Royal Academy of Dance. The training of dancers in Britain is noted for its slow progression, with a great deal of attention paid to basic technique.

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
