

The Beatles Tomorrow Never Knows Guitar Recorded Versions

The album was George Martin's final album as a producer before his death in 2016.

List of songs recorded by the Beatles the group led him to be referred to as the "Fifth Beatle". Since their break-up, over 100 more songs by the group have been officially released, including live songs the group never recorded in the studio and numerous outtakes. The band also recorded several songs that remain unreleased. Often considered the most influential band of the rock era, the group's music pioneered new recording techniques and was primarily responsible for pop music's evolution into an art form. The group's "main catalogue"—songs released between 1962 and 1970—consists of 213 songs (four of which exist in different versions): 188 originals and 25 covers. The majority of their recordings were produced by George Martin, who also played and composed string arrangements on. Between 1962 and 1968, the Beatles released their songs in both mono and stereo versions; The Beatles were an English rock band from Liverpool who recorded hundreds of songs during their career.

Rain (Beatles song) "Rain" was written by John Lennon and credited to the Lennon–McCartney partnership. Both songs were recorded during the sessions for *Revolver*, although neither appear on that album. the first times that reversed sounds appeared in a pop song, although the Beatles used the same technique on the *Revolver* track "Tomorrow Never Knows"; "Rain" is a song by the English rock band the Beatles, released on 30 May 1966 as the B-side of their "Paperback Writer" single. It has since become regarded as one of the greatest and most innovative albums in the history of popular music, with recognition centred on its range of musical styles, diverse sounds and lyrical content.

When writing the song, Lennon drew inspiration from his experiences with the hallucinogenic drug LSD and from the 1964 book *The Psychedelic Experience: A Manual Based on the Tibetan Book of the Dead* by Timothy Leary, Richard Alpert and Ralph Metzner. The Beatles' recording employed musical elements foreign to pop music, including *musique concrète*, *avant...*

Tomorrow Never Came The song features vocals from American-British musician Sean Ono Lennon, who co-wrote and co-produced the song alongside Del Rey and Rick Nowels. "Jeremy Gordon of *Spin* compared the song to The Beatles' "Tomorrow Never Knows", declaring it to be an unofficial sequel. singing with Sean.
