Undiscovered until the late 19th and early 20th centuries, they are often believed to be the earliest branch to have split from the Proto Indo-European family. While Hittite attestation ends after the Bronze Age, hieroglyphic Luwian survived until the conquest of the Neo-Hittite kingdoms by the Semitic Assyrian Empire, and alphabetic inscriptions in Anatolian languages are fragmentarily attested until the early first millennium... 87d283a8d3

Linear B The succeeding period, known as the Greek Dark Ages, provides no evidence of the use of writing. It is adapted from the earlier Linear A, an undeciphered script perhaps used for writing the Minoan language, as is the later Cypriot syllabary, which also recorded Greek. Reading comprehension Comprehension specifically is a "creative, multifaceted process" that is dependent upon four language skills: phonology, syntax, semantics, and pragmatics. multifaceted process" that is dependent upon four language skills: phonology, syntax, semantics, and pragmatics. The opposite of reading comprehension is called functional illiteracy. Reading comprehension occurs on a gradient or spectrum, rather than being yes/no (all-or-nothing). In education it is measured in standardized tests that report which percentile a reader's ability falls. Reading comprehension is beyond basic literacy alone, which is the ability to decipher characters and words at all. Reading comprehension relies on two abilities that are connected to each other: word reading and language comprehension.
