State-enforced laws can be made by a legislature, resulting in statutes; by the executive through decrees and regulations; or by judges' decisions, which form precedent in common law jurisdictions. An autocrat may exercise those functions within their realm. Investigating, apprehending, charging, and trying suspected offenders is regulated by the law of criminal procedure. The paradigm case of a crime lies in Law is a set of rules that are created and are enforceable by social or governmental institutions to regulate behavior, with its precise definition a matter of longstanding debate. The law shapes politics, economics, history and society in various ways and also serves as a mediator of relations between people. Inquest Generally, inquests are conducted only when deaths are sudden or unexplained. In general usage, inquest is also used to mean any investigation or inquiry. A coroner's jury may be convened to assist in this type of proceeding. Inquest can also mean such a jury and the result of such an investigation. Since juries are not used in most European civil law systems An inquest is a judicial inquiry in common law jurisdictions, particularly one held to determine the cause of a person's death. An inquest may be called at the behest of a coroner, judge, prosecutor, or, in some jurisdictions, upon a formal request from the public. accident, criminal prosecution may follow, and suspects are able to defend themselves there. Early Irish law For centuries, these secular laws existed in parallel, and occasionally in conflict, with canon law and English common law, the latter of which was first introduced in Ireland in the 12th century. The laws were a civil rather than a criminal code, concerned with the payment of compensation for harm done and the regulation of property Early Irish law, also called Brehon law (from the old Irish word breithim meaning judge), comprised the statutes which governed everyday life in Gaelic Ireland. the 12th century. Early Irish law was often mixed with Christian influence and juristic innovation. They applied in Early Medieval Ireland and were partially eclipsed by the Norman invasion of 1169, but underwent a resurgence on most of the territory of the island from the 13th century, coexisting in parallel with English common law, which eventually surpassed them in the 17th century 520a69e42b

It remained one of the few capital offences after reform of the death penalty in 1861, and remained in effect even after the death penalty was permanently abolished for murder in 1969.
