Saturation diving The diver undergoes a single decompression to surface pressure at the end of the exposure of several days to weeks duration. Unlike other ambient pressure diving, the saturation diver is only exposed to external ambient pressure while at diving depth. The ratio of productive working time at depth to unproductive decompression time is thereby increased, and

the health risk to the diver incurred by decompression is minimised. The intravenous route of administration is commonly used for rehydration or to provide nutrients for those who cannot, or will not—due to reduced mental states or otherwise—consume food or water by mouth. Attempts at providing intravenous therapy have been recorded as early as the 1400s, but the practice did not become widespread until the 1900s after the development of techniques for safe, effective use. It may also be used to administer medications or other medical therapy such as blood products or electrolytes to correct electrolyte imbalances. If placed with proper aseptic technique, it is not recommended to change a peripheral IV line more frequently Intravenous therapy (abbreviated as IV therapy) is a medical process that administers fluids, medications and nutrients directly into a person's vein c77d496892
