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LRL vector is conserved in all problems in which two bodies interact by a central force that varies as the inverse square of the distance between them; such problems are called Kepler problems. For two bodies interacting by Newtonian gravity, the LRL vector is a constant of motion, meaning that it is the same no matter where it is calculated on the orbit; equivalently, the LRL vector is said to be conserved

Surface integral If a region R is not flat, then it is called a surface as shown in the illustration. Given a surface, one may integrate over this surface a scalar field (that is, a function of position which returns a scalar as a value), or a vector field (that is, a function which returns a vector as value). It was introduced by B. S. Tsirelson in 1974. Triviality (mathematics) The opposite of trivial is nontrivial, which is commonly used to indicate that an example or a solution is not simple, or that a statement or a theorem is not easy to

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prove. The origin of the term in mathematical language comes from the medieval trivium curriculum, which distinguishes from the more difficult quadrivium curriculum. $\{\mathbf{x}\}$ is an unknown vector, and $\mathbf{0}$ is the zero vector, has an obvious solution $\mathbf{x} = \mathbf{0}$. In mathematics, the adjective trivial is often used to refer to a claim or a case which can be readily obtained from context, or a particularly simple object possessing a given structure (e. g. , group, topological space). The noun triviality usually refers to a simple technical aspect of some proof or definition
