TPR Storytelling Throughout these three steps, the teacher will use a number of techniques to help make the target language comprehensible to the students, including careful limiting of vocabulary, constant asking of easy comprehension questions, frequent comprehension. TPRS lessons use a mixture of reading and storytelling to help students learn a foreign language in a classroom setting. The method works in three steps: in step one the new vocabulary structures to be learned are taught using a combination of translation, gestures, and personalized questions; in step two those structures are used in a spoken class story; and finally, in step three, these same structures are used in a class reading. Reading comprehension Reading comprehension occurs on a gradient or spectrum, rather than being yes/no (all-or-nothing). topic-related words and phrases before reading a book to students. Comprehension specifically is a "creative, multifaceted process" that is dependent upon four language skills: phonology, syntax, semantics, and pragmatics. The opposite of reading comprehension is called functional illiteracy. Reading comprehension is beyond basic literacy alone, which is the ability to decipher characters and words at all. Reading comprehension relies on two abilities that are connected to each other: word reading and language comprehension. Note also that teaching includes topic-related word groups, synonyms of words, and their meaning Reading comprehension is the ability to process written text, understand its meaning, and to integrate with what the reader already knows. In education it is measured in standardized tests that report which percentile a reader's ability falls b423326fda

Extensive reading It stands in contrast to intensive or academic reading, which is focused on a close reading

of dense, shorter texts, typically not read for pleasure. Though used as a teaching strategy to Extensive reading (ER) is the process of reading longer, easier texts for an extended period of time without a breakdown of comprehension, feeling overwhelmed, or the need to take breaks. Though used as a teaching strategy to promote second-language development, ER also applies to free voluntary reading and recreational reading both in and out of the classroom.
