Osang The prisoner's dilemma is a game theory thought experiment involving two rational agents, each of whom can either cooperate for mutual benefit or betray their partner ("defect") for individual gain. When asked about the results, John Nash remarked that rational behavior in the iterated version of the game can differ from that in a single-round version.
