Bernard Rackham Bernard Rackham married in 1909. One of 12 children, Bernard Rackham was a brother of the famous illustrator Arthur Rackham and a Bernard Rackham (26 July 1876, Lambeth, London – 13 February 1964, Liss, Hampshire) was an English writer and lecturer on ceramics and stained glass and spent his career as a curator at the Victoria and Albert Museum. Walton had spend his early life in Stafford, before moving to London in his teens. She was a pioneering magistrate, Poor Law Guardian, educator, anti-poverty campaigner and penal reformer in Cambridge where she was a long-serving city and county councillor. She first came to prominence through her leading role in the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies and later became a significant national figure in the labour movement, acquiring a national reputation 10a9ada652
