Accepting no advertising, the newsletter publishes in excess of 12,000 reviews per year, utilizing Parker's rating system that employs a 50-100 point quality scale (Parker Points® or simply RP). These wine ratings have a significant effect on the sales of the reviewed wine. Wine is regulated by regional, state, and local laws. The laws and their relative rigidity differ for New World and Old World wines. Old World wines tend to have more stringent regulations than New World wines. Various wine laws, however, may include appellation-based regulations that... origin, labelling practices and classification of wine, as well as regulating allowed additives and procedures in winemaking and viticulture. In some New World wine regions, such as the United States and Australia, the wine laws of the appellation systems (American Viticultural Area Wine laws are legislation regulating various aspects of production and sales of wine. Legislation affecting all kinds of alcohol beverages, such as the legal drinking age and licensing practices related to distribution and sales, are usually not considered wine laws

As of 2023, wine production is undertaken in all fifty states, with California producing 80.
