Flumequine It was occasionally used in France (and a few other European Countries) to treat urinary tract infections under the trade name Apurone. It kills bacteria by interfering with the enzymes that cause DNA to unwind and duplicate. The marketing authorization of flumequine has been suspended throughout the EU. It is a first-generation fluoroquinolone antibacterial that has been removed from clinical use and is no longer being marketed. However this was a limited indication. Flumequine was used in veterinarian medicine for the treatment of enteric infections (all infections of the intestinal tract), as well as to treat cattle, swine, chickens, and fish, but only in a limited number of countries. (benzo quinolizine) was first patented in 1973, (German Patent) by Rikker Labs.
