Oedipus complex Modern productions of Sophocles's play were staged in Paris and Vienna In classical psychoanalytic theory, the Oedipus complex is a son's sexual attitude towards his mother and concomitant hostility toward his father, first formed during the phallic stage of psychosexual development. A daughter's attitude of desire for her father and hostility toward her mother is referred to as the feminine (or female) Oedipus complex. A play based on the myth, Oedipus Rex, was written by Sophocles, c. 429 BC. The general concept was considered by Sigmund Freud in *The Interpretation of Dreams* (1899), although the term itself was introduced in his paper "A Special Type of Choice of Object Made by Men" (1910). 2c634b332c
