Philosophy of science Prominent among the unsolved problems was the failure to find an acceptable statement Philosophy of science is the branch of philosophy concerned with the foundations, methods, and implications of science. Ethical issues such as bioethics and scientific misconduct are often considered. Amongst its central questions are the difference between science and non-science, the reliability of scientific theories, and the ultimate purpose and meaning of science as a human endeavour. Philosophy of science focuses on metaphysical, epistemic and semantic aspects of scientific practice, and overlaps with metaphysics, ontology, logic, and epistemology, for example, when it explores the relationship between science and the concept of truth. positivism failed to solve many of the central problems it generated for itself. Philosophy of science is both a theoretical and empirical discipline, relying on philosophical theorising as well as meta-studies of scientific practice

"Leadership" is a contested term. Specialist literature debates various viewpoints on the concept, sometimes contrasting Eastern and Western approaches to leadership, and also (within the West) North American versus European approaches.

Fair division cake-cutting problem had been one of the most important open problems in 20th century mathematics, when the most important variant of the problem was finally solved. Fair division is the problem in game theory of dividing a set of resources among several people who have an entitlement to them so that each person receives their due share. The central tenet of fair division is that such a division should be performed by the players themselves, without the need for external arbitration, as only the players themselves really know how they value the goods

Despite this, the field is important to the study of real human behavior by social scientists, as it lays the foundations to mathematically model and analyze individuals in fields such as sociology, economics, criminology, cognitive science, moral philosophy and political science. It differs from the cognitive and behavioral sciences in that it is mainly prescriptive and concerned with identifying optimal decisions for a rational agent, rather than describing how people actually make decisions

Postmodern philosophy Postmodern philosophy questions the importance of power relationships, personalization, and discourse in the "construction" of truth and world views. emphasizing the problem of the philosopher cleanly distinguishing knowledge from ignorance, social progress from reversion, dominance from submission Postmodern philosophy is a philosophical movement that arose in the second half of the 20th century as a critical response to assumptions allegedly present in modernist philosophical ideas regarding culture, identity, history, or language that were developed during the 18th-century Age of Enlightenment. Many postmodernists appear to deny that an objective reality exists, and appear to deny that there are objective moral values. Postmodernist thinkers developed concepts like *différance*, repetition, trace, and hyperreality to subvert "grand narratives", univocity of being, and epistemic certainty

Leadership They found Leadership, is defined as the ability of an individual, group, or organization to "lead", influence, or guide other individuals, teams, or organizations. In one study, van Vugt and his team looked at the relation between

Both of these branches of genetics use the frequencies of different alleles of a gene in breeding populations (gamodemes), and combine them with concepts from simple Mendelian inheritance to analyze inheritance patterns across generations and descendant lines. While population genetics can focus on particular genes and their subsequent metabolic products, quantitative genetics focuses more on the outward phenotypes, and makes only summaries of the underlying genetics. "a form of behavior characterized by a confident declaration or affirmation of a statement without need of proof; this affirms the person's rights or point of view without either aggressively threatening the rights of another (assuming a position of dominance) or submissively permitting another to ignore or deny one's rights or point of view."

Quantitative genetics the dominance is regarded as partial or incomplete—while $d=a$ indicates full or classical dominance. Mendel's Quantitative genetics is the study of quantitative traits, which are phenotypes that vary continuously—such as height or mass—as opposed to phenotypes and gene-products that are discretely identifiable—such as eye-colour, or the presence of a particular biochemical. Previously, $d>a$ was known as "over-dominance"

John von Neumann He was a pioneer in building the mathematical framework of quantum physics, in the development of functional analysis, and in game theory, introducing or codifying concepts including cellular automata, the universal constructor and the digital computer. it had a precise mathematical form, which allowed for clear answers to conceptual problems. Nevertheless, von Neumann in his later years felt he had failed John von Neumann (von NOY-mən; Hungarian: Neumann János Lajos ['nɔjmɒn 'ja:nɔʃ 'lɔjoʃ]; December 28, 1903 – February 8, 1957) was a Hungarian and American mathematician, physicist, computer scientist and engineer. Von Neumann had perhaps the widest coverage of any mathematician of his time, integrating pure and applied sciences and making major contributions to many fields, including mathematics, physics, economics, computing, and statistics. His analysis of the structure of self-replication preceded the discovery of the structure of DNA

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
