One popular and influential writer of early gay novels, Mary Renault, was a lesbian woman. Many early novels depicting (or even alluding to) homosexuality were published anonymously or pseudonymously, or like *Maurice*, sat unpublished until after the death of the author, reflecting authors' fear of opprobrium,
