Snake Lizards have independently evolved elongate bodies without limbs or with greatly reduced limbs at least twenty-five times via convergent evolution. Some species retain a pelvic girdle with a pair of vestigial claws on either side of the cloaca. Pythons and boas—primitive groups among modern snakes—have vestigial hind limbs: tiny, clawed digits Snakes are elongated limbless reptiles of the suborder Serpentes (). To accommodate their narrow bodies, snakes' paired organs (such as kidneys) appear one in front of the other instead of side by side, and most only have one functional lung. Many species of snakes have skulls with several more joints than their lizard ancestors and relatives, enabling them to swallow prey much larger than their heads (cranial kinesis) 1dadeb3c6c

Since their armoured plates are often preserved and are abundant in certain localities, aetosaurs. They were medium- to large-sized omnivorous or herbivorous pseudosuchians, part of the branch of archosaurs more closely related to crocodilians than to birds and other dinosaurs. All known aetosaurs are restricted to the Late Triassic, and in some strata from this time they are among the most abundant fossil vertebrates. Aetosaur fossil remains are known from Europe, North and South America, parts of Africa, and India 1dadeb3c6c

Several groups of modern species are habitual bipeds whose normal method of locomotion is two-legged. In the Triassic period some groups of archosaurs (a group that includes crocodiles and dinosaurs) developed bipedalism; among the dinosaurs, all the early forms and many later groups were habitual or exclusive bipeds; the birds are members of a clade of exclusively bipedal dinosaurs, the theropods.
