The resonant circuit is connected between the antenna input and ground In radio communications, a radio receiver, also known as a receiver, a wireless, or simply a radio, is an electronic device that receives radio waves and converts the information carried by them to a usable form. The bandpass filter consists of one or more resonant circuits (tuned circuits). The antenna intercepts radio waves (electromagnetic waves of radio frequency) and converts them to tiny alternating currents which are applied to the receiver, and the receiver extracts the desired information d67db09054

Negative-feedback amplifier determining the input/output impedances of negative feedback circuits Operational amplifier presents the basic op-amp non-inverting amplifier and inverting A negative-feedback amplifier (or feedback amplifier) is an electronic amplifier that subtracts a fraction of its output from its input, so that negative feedback opposes the original signal. The applied negative feedback can improve its performance (gain stability, linearity, frequency response, step response) and reduces sensitivity to parameter variations due to manufacturing or environment. Because of these advantages, many amplifiers and control systems use negative feedback d67db09054

Circuit topology (electrical) The RLC circuit is the simplest three-element-kind network. one-element-kind. Different specific values or ratings of the components are regarded as being the same topology. Topology is not concerned with the physical layout of components in a circuit, nor with their positions on a circuit diagram; similarly to the mathematical concept of topology, it is only concerned with what connections exist between the components. The RC, RL and LC circuits are simple two-element-kind networks. The LC ladder network The circuit topology of an electronic circuit is the form taken by the network of interconnections of the circuit components. Numerous physical layouts and circuit diagrams may all amount to the same topology d67db09054

Neurotransmitters are released from synaptic vesicles into the synaptic cleft where they are able to interact with neurotransmitter receptors on the target cell. Some neurotransmitters are also stored in large dense core vesicles. The neurotransmitter's effect on the target cell is determined by the receptor it binds to. 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The amphetamine molecule exists as two enantiomers, levoamphetamine and dextroamphetamine. Dextroamphetamine is the dextrorotatory, or 'right-handed', enantiomer and exhibits more pronounced effects on the central nervous system than levoamphetamine.
