Fourier transform In mathematics, the Fourier transform (FT) is an integral transform that takes a function as input then outputs another function that describes the extent to which various frequencies are present in the original function. The term Fourier transform refers to both this complex-valued function and the mathematical operation. When a distinction

needs to be made, the output of the operation is sometimes called the frequency domain representation of the original function. The output of the transform is a complex-valued function of frequency. The Fourier transform is analogous to decomposing the sound of a musical chord into the intensities of its constituent pitches

The DFT is obtained by decomposing a sequence of values into components of different frequencies. This operation is useful in many fields, but computing it directly from the definition is often too slow to be practical. An FFT rapidly computes such transformations by factorizing the DFT matrix into a product of sparse (mostly zero) factors. As a result, it manages to reduce the complexity of computing the DFT from $O(N^2)$ to $O(N \log N)$.

The term discrete-time refers to the fact that the transform operates on discrete data, often samples whose interval has units of time. From uniformly spaced samples it produces a function of frequency that is a periodic summation of the continuous Fourier transform of the original continuous function. In simpler terms, when you take the DTFT of regularly-spaced samples of a continuous signal, you get repeating (and possibly overlapping) copies of the signal's frequency spectrum, spaced at intervals corresponding to the sampling frequency. Well-behaved functions, for example smooth functions, have Fourier series that converge. This application is possible because the derivatives of trigonometric functions fall into simple patterns. By expressing a function as a sum of sines and cosines, many problems involving the function become easier to analyze because trigonometric functions are well understood. The Fourier series is an example of a trigonometric series.
