Cognitive behavioral therapy It is different from other approaches to psychotherapy, such as Cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT) is a form of psychotherapy that aims to reduce symptoms of various mental health conditions, primarily depression, and disorders such as PTSD and anxiety disorders. This alteration in a person's thinking produces less anxiety and depression. This therapy focuses on challenging unhelpful and irrational negative thoughts and beliefs, referred to as 'self-talk' and replacing them with more rational positive self-talk. based on the combination of the basic principles from behavioral and cognitive psychology.
