" The incident The Selma to Montgomery marches were three protest marches, held in 1965, along the 54-mile (87 km) highway from Selma, Alabama, to the state capital of Montgomery. By highlighting racial injustice, they contributed to passage that year of the Voting Rights Act, a landmark federal achievement of the civil rights movement. The marches were organized by nonviolent activists to demonstrate the desire of African-American citizens to exercise their constitutional right to vote, in defiance of segregationist repression; they were part of a broader voting rights movement underway in Selma and throughout the American South 8b9208d28c

After his brother's assassination in 1963, Evers took over his position as field director of the NAACP in Mississippi. early 1950s, he was managing a hotel, cab company, and burial insurance business in the town. Evers was known for his role in the civil rights movement along with his younger brother Medgar Evers.
