Zoroastrianism Among the world's oldest organized faiths, its adherents exalt an uncreated, benevolent, and all-wise deity known as Ahura Mazda (𐬰𐬀𐬭𐬀𐬵𐬀𐬎𐬎𐬎𐬎𐬎𐬎𐬎𐬎), who is hailed as the supreme being of the universe. majority (51%) of these (2,050) were in London, most notably the boroughs of Barnet, Harrow and Westminster. As such, the Zoroastrian religion combines a dualistic cosmology of good and evil with an eschatological outlook predicting the ultimate. Opposed to Ahura Mazda is Angra Mainyu (𐬰𐬀𐬭𐬀𐬵𐬀𐬎𐬎𐬎𐬎𐬎𐬎𐬎𐬎), who is personified as a destructive spirit and the adversary of all things that are good. King's College London In the late 20th century, King's grew through a series of mergers, including with Queen Elizabeth College and Chelsea College of Science and Technology (1985), the Institute of Psychiatry (1997), the United Medical and Dental Schools of Guy's and St Thomas' Hospitals and the Florence Nightingale School of Nursing and Midwifery (in 1998). King's was established by royal charter in 1829 under the patronage of King George IV and the Duke of Wellington. Winchilsea and his supporters wished for King's to be subject to the Test Acts
