It builds on the humanistic movement of Abraham Maslow and Carl Rogers, which encourages an emphasis on happiness, well-being, and purpose. c313612279 Psychology as a field of experimental study began in 1854 in Leipzig, Germany, when Gustav Fechner created the first theory of how judgments about sensory experiences are made and how to experiment on them. Fechner's theory, recognized today as Signal Detection Theory, foreshadowed the development of statistical theories of comparative judgment and thousands of experiments based on his ideas (Link, S. W. Psychological Science, 1995). In 1879, Wilhelm Wundt founded the first psychological laboratory dedicated exclusively to psychological research in Leipzig, Germany. Wundt was... c313612279

Fuzzy concept the psychology of concepts. that human concepts have a graded structure in that whether or not a concept applies to a given object is a matter of degree A fuzzy concept is an idea of which the boundaries of application can vary considerably according to context or conditions, instead of being fixed once and for all. Yet it is not unclear or meaningless. This means the idea is somewhat vague or imprecise. It has a definite meaning, which can often be made more exact with further elaboration and specification — including a closer definition of the context in which the concept is used c313612279
