Anthropologists have pointed out that through culture, people can

adapt to their environment in non-genetic ways, so people living in different environments will often have different cultures. Much of anthropological theory has originated in an appreciation of and interest in the tension between the local (particular cultures) and the global (a universal human nature, or the web of connections between people in distinct places/circumstances).

With the rise of Christianity this became characterised with the contrast between divine miracles versus folk religion, superstition, or occult speculation. Such concepts tend to appear more frequently in cultures based in polytheism, animism, or shamanism. Anthropology Anthropology is the scientific study of humanity that crosses biology and sociology, concerned with human behavior, human biology, cultures, societies Anthropology is the scientific study of humanity that crosses biology and sociology, concerned with human behavior, human biology, cultures, societies, and linguistics, in both the present and past, including archaic humans. The term sociocultural anthropology is commonly used today. Social anthropology studies patterns of behaviour, while cultural anthropology studies cultural meaning, including norms and values.
