Oscar Wilde Wilde is best known for his Gothic novel *The Picture of Dorian Gray* (1890), his epigrams, plays, and bedtime stories for children, as well as his criminal conviction in 1895 for gross indecency for homosexual acts. After writing in different literary styles throughout the 1880s, he became one of the most popular and influential dramatists in London in the early 1890s. After university, Wilde moved to London into Oscar Fingal O'Flahertie Wills Wilde (16 October 1854 – 30 November 1900) was an Irish author, poet, and playwright. From 1929 to 1947, Wittgenstein taught at the University of Cambridge.
