Easwaran was a professor of English literature at

the University of Nagpur in India when he came to the United States in 1959 on the Fulbright Program at the University of Minnesota before moving to Berkeley and registering as a visiting scholar at the University of California, Berkeley. In 1961, Easwaran founded the Blue Mountain Center of Meditation, based in northern California. In 1968 Easwaran established Nilgiri Press. Nilgiri Press has published over thirty books that he authored.

Richard Rolle Indeed, until the nineteenth century northern English medieval religious texts were regularly mis-attributed to him because of his ongoing authority. *Classics of Western Spirituality*, (Paulist Press / SPCK, 1988) [includes modern translations of *The English Psalter and Commentary* Richard Rolle (c. 1300 – 30 September 1349) was an English hermit, mystic, and religious writer. introduced by Rosamund Allen. He is also known as Richard Rolle of Hampole or de Hampole, since at the end of his life he lived near a Cistercian nunnery in Hampole, now in South Yorkshire. In many ways, he can be considered the first English author due to the reported influence (both locally and internationally) of his vernacular works starting soon after his death and continuing for centuries

862e07774f Born in Manchester, England, Wood was educated at the Manchester Municipal College of Technology, where he studied chemistry, physics and geology. Because of his interest in Buddhism and Yoga, he began studying Sanskrit during his late teen years. He became president of his local Theosophist chapter in 1907 at age 24, then embraced the larger world by moving in 1908 to Adyar, India, the Society's world headquarters. 862e07774f Marcus Aurelius wrote the 12 books of the Meditations in Koine Greek as a source for his own guidance and self-improvement. It is possible that large portions of the work were written at Sirmium (modern-day Sremska Mitrovica, Serbia), where he spent much time planning military campaigns in 170–180 AD.
