For modern IQ tests, the raw score is transformed to a normal distribution with mean 100 and standard deviation 15. Originally, IQ was a score obtained by dividing a person's estimated mental age, obtained by administering an intelligence test, by the person's chronological age. The results would not depend on the machine's ability to answer questions correctly, only on how closely its answers resembled those of a human. In the test, a human evaluator judges a text transcript of a natural-language conversation between a human and a machine aa94d25450

(Q-data, in terms of LOTS data) measures or reports from life records (L-data) such as rating scales. Attempts to construct actual performance tests of personality have been very limited even though Raymond Cattell with his colleague Frank Warburton compiled a list of over 2000 separate objective tests that could be used in constructing objective personality tests. The conventional method of scoring items is to assign 0 for an incorrect answer and 1 for a correct answer.
