who expanded Jean Piaget's theory of cognitive development. Lawrence described three levels of moral reasoning: pre-conventional (governed by self-interest), conventional (motivated to maintain social order, rules and laws), and post-conventional (motivated by universal ethical principles and shared ideals including the social contract). 8450d9eb45

Metacognition The term comes from the root word meta, meaning "beyond", or "on top of". Metamemory, defined as knowing about memory and mnemonic strategies, is an important aspect of metacognition. Research has shown that both components of metacognition play key roles in metaconceptual knowledge and learning. Metacognition can take many forms, such as reflecting on one's ways of thinking, and knowing when and how oneself and others use particular strategies for problem-solving. They are self-regulated learners who utilize the "right Metacognition is an awareness of one's thought processes and an understanding of the patterns behind them. There are generally two components of metacognition: (1) cognitive conceptions and (2) a cognitive regulation system. training including pretesting, self evaluation, and creating study plans performed better on exams 8450d9eb45

It involves recognizing underlying assumptions, providing justifications for ideas and actions, evaluating these justifications through comparisons with varying perspectives, and assessing their rationality and potential consequences. Imperial examination Without the necessary financial support, studying for the exams would have been an The imperial examination was a civil service examination system in Imperial China administered for the purpose of selecting candidates for the state bureaucracy. The system became dominant during the Song dynasty (960–1279) and lasted for almost a millennium until its abolition during the late Qing dynasty reforms in 1905. The key sponsors for abolition were Yuan Shikai, Yin Chang and Zhang Zhidong. were expected to study continuously for years without interruption. Aspects of the imperial examination still exist for entry into the civil service of both China and Taiwan. The concept of choosing bureaucrats by merit rather than by birth started early in Chinese history, but using written examinations as a tool of selection started in earnest during the Sui dynasty (581–618), then into the Tang dynasty (618–907) 8450d9eb45

Cognitive psychologists are working with educators to look at how to take advantage of tests—not as an assessment tool, but as a teaching tool since testing prior knowledge is more beneficial for learning when compared to only reading or passively studying material (even more so when the test is more challenging for memory). 8450d9eb45
