One of the most influential theologians in the late fourth-century church, he was well known as a thinker, polished speaker, and gifted writer. He was a teacher. He then went to Egypt and spent the remaining years of his life in Nitria and Kellia, marked by years of asceticism and writing. Vitae Patrum (a collection of sayings from early Christian monks). He left a promising ecclesiastical career in Constantinople and traveled to Jerusalem, where in 383 AD he became a monk at the monastery of Rufinus and Melania the Elder d221631a99
