Differential extraction The protamines sequester DNA from spermatozoa, making it more resilient to DNA extraction than DNA from epithelial cells. Its success is based on the fact that sperm cells pack their DNA using protamines (rather than histones) which are held together by disulfide bonds. impractical for forensic laboratories and cannot be justified. Recently a multistep nucleic acid extraction procedure was introduced to provide DNA lysates of Differential extraction (also known as differential lysis) refers to the process by which the DNA from two different types of cells can be extracted without mixing their contents. The most common application of this method is the extraction of DNA from vaginal epithelial cells and sperm cells from sexual assault cases in order to determine the DNA profiles of the victim and the perpetrator 643492a710
