Barbary Shore "Last of the Leftists Barbary Shore is Norman Mailer's second published novel, written after Mailer's great success with his 1948 debut The Naked and the Dead. Wounded during World War II, he is an amnesiac, and much of his past is a secret to him. It concerns a protagonist who rents a room in a Brooklyn boarding house with the intention of writing a novel. The failure of Barbary Shore and moderate success of Mailer's next novel, The Deer Park (1955) triggered a decade-long hiatus from the novel by Mailer, which ended with the publication of An American Dream in 1965.
