History of biology Although the concept of biology as a single coherent field arose in the 19th century, the biological sciences emerged from traditions of medicine and natural history reaching back to Ayurveda, ancient Egyptian medicine and the works of Aristotle, Theophrastus and Galen in the ancient Greco-Roman world. During the European Renaissance and early modern period, biological thought was revolutionized in Europe by a renewed interest in empiricism and the discovery of many novel organisms. enzymes was well established, though equations of chemical kinetics would not be applied to enzymatic reactions until the early 20th century. Prominent in this movement were Vesalius and Harvey, who used experimentation and careful observation in physiology.

Glutaraldehyde Crosslinking can rigidify and deactivate proteins and other molecules that are critical for normal biological function, such as DNA, and so glutaraldehyde solutions are effective biocides and fixatives. As a disinfectant, it is used to sterilize surgical. Because the molecule has two aldehyde functional groups, glutaraldehyde (and its hydrates) can crosslink substances with primary amine groups, through condensation. This reaction occurs at alkaline pH values Glutaraldehyde is an organic compound with the formula $(\text{CH}_2)_3(\text{CHO})_2$. It is usually used as a solution in water, and such solutions exists as a collection of hydrates, cyclic derivatives, and condensation products, several of which interconvert.
