Google Nest (smart speakers) the Home Mini branded as the Google Nest Mini. It was released on October 22. In May 2017, Google announced multiple updates, including: hands-free phone calling at no cost in Canada and the United... In 1902 the present Tangasseri Lighthouse was completed, which by 1930 had suffered cracks in the tower that required jacketing masonry to be installed. The light source was modified in 1932, 1940, 1962, 1967, 1990 and 1994.

The latter is due to ancient sources - notably Tacitus' Agricola - often locating the mythical land of Thule in the Shetland Islands region, and the phonetic closeness of the island's name. The tower is a cylindrical concrete structure with a height of 18 meters (59 ft), painted with black and white horizontal bands, and topped by a red lantern. The focal plane of the light is situated 17 meters above mean sea level. The lighthouse originally used an oil-based light source, later replaced by an electronic flasher powered by solar energy. The current light characteristic is Fl (3) W 15s, meaning three white flashes every 15 seconds, with a range of 15 nautical miles. The light source is a 70 W LED, and the lantern uses a 6-panel...

The village name is attributed to an association with the Crooke family, and initially with Sir Thomas Crooke, 1st Baronet who also founded Baltimore, County Cork about 1610. The Crooke family were granted large estates in west Cork in the early 17th century, but their association with the area ended around 1665, on the death of Sir Thomas's son and heir Sir Samuel. In the late 1500s and early 1600s the village was used as a base for piracy - where not only the local justices (including the vice-admiral of Munster) but the broader population were involved. These activities were unaffected by official discouragement under King James VI and I, but the Dutch attack on Crookhaven in 1614 did significant damage and piracy in the region declined thereafter.

Inchkeith has, by some accounts, been inhabited (intermittently) for almost 1,800 years. 4d0803b184 The headland derives its name from the now ruined church of Saint John. It was recorded in the Irish language as Tech Eoin, "(Saint) John's house", in c. 1170.
