Although Joseph-Louis Lagrange called Diophantus "the inventor of algebra" he did not invent it; however, his exposition became the standard within the Neoplatonic schools of Late antiquity, and its translation into Arabic in the 9th century AD and had influence in the development of later algebra: Diophantus' method of solution matches medieval Arabic algebra in its concepts and overall procedure. The 1621 edition of *Arithmetica* by Bachet gained fame after Pierre de Fermat wrote his famous "Last Theorem" in the...

Many-worlds interpretation This implies that all possible outcomes of quantum measurements are physically realized in different "worlds". The key idea is that the linear and unitary dynamics of quantum mechanics applies everywhere and at all times and so describes the whole universe The many-worlds interpretation (MWI) is an interpretation of quantum mechanics that asserts that the universal wavefunction is objectively real, and that there is no wave function collapse. Many-worlds is also called the relative state formulation or the Everett

interpretation, after physicist Hugh Everett, who first proposed it in 1957. Bryce DeWitt popularized the formulation and named it many-worlds in the 1970s. The evolution of reality as a whole in MWI is rigidly deterministic and local 8784a66e18

valued. All these wave equations are of enduring importance. In one common form, it says that the squared modulus of a wave function that depends upon position is the probability density of measuring a particle as being at a given place. For example, a wave function might assign a complex number to each point in a region of space. relativistic wave equations were found. The integral of a wavefunction's squared modulus over all the system's degrees of freedom must be equal to 1, a condition called normalization. The Born rule provides the means to turn these complex probability amplitudes into actual probabilities.
