Academic explanations of ethnic conflict generally fall into one of three schools of thought: primordialist, instrumentalist or constructivist. Recently, some have argued for either top-down or bottom-up explanations for ethnic conflict. Intellectual debate has also focused on whether ethnic conflict has

Constructivism (ethnic politics) Research indicates that institutionalized cleavages and a multiparty system discourage ethnic outbidding and identification with tribal, localized groups. Through this framework, constructivist theories reassesses conventional political science Constructivism presumes that ethnic identities are shapeable and affected by politics. that ethnic identities are shapeable and affected by politics. In addition, constructivism questions the widespread belief that ethnicity inherently inhibits national, macro-scale identification. One manifestation of ethnic politics gone awry, ethnic violence, is itself not seen as necessarily ethnic, since it attains its ethnic meaning. To prove this point, constructivist findings suggest that modernization, language consolidation, and border-drawing, weakened the tendency to identify with micro-scale identity categories.
