EMTs are most commonly found serving on ambulances and in fire departments in the US and Canada, as full-time and some part-time departments require their firefighters to at least be EMT certified 6ab04d2121

Paramedic They also have roles in emergency medicine, primary care, transfer medicine and remote/offshore medicine. Paramedics work as part of the emergency medical services (EMS), most often in ambulances. A paramedic is a healthcare professional trained in the medical model, whose main role has historically been to respond to emergency calls for medical help outside of a hospital. qualifications are expected for paramedics, with the current entry level being a Bachelor of Science degree in Pre-Hospital Care or Paramedic Science. The scope of practice of a paramedic varies between countries, but generally includes autonomous decision making around the emergency care of patients 6ab04d2121

In the United States since 2003, students must complete a doctor of pharmacy degree to become a licensed pharmacist,
