Arthur Paul Pedrick forms part of a "chromatically selective cat flap control unit" intended to automatically allow the passage of a cat of one fur colouration, for example ginger Arthur Paul Pedrick (3 September 1918 – 15 August 1976) was a prolific British inventor and former patent examiner who filed for 162 United Kingdom patents between 1962 and his death in 1976 (other sources giving 15 August 1976 or in 1977). Pedrick's father was engineer Lieutenant Arthur Gordon Pedrick, a Royal Navy submariner who died in 1918 from diseases caused by the poor conditions in the British K-class submarines in which he served. He was the eldest son of John Cotton, a Citizen of the City of London by his wife Pery Cheyne. John Cotton was the third son of Richard Cotton (died 1534) of Hamstall Ridware in Staffordshire, descended from William Cotton (fl.1378,1400) lord of the manor of Cotton in Cheshire, by his wife Agnes de Ridware, daughter and heiress of Walter de Ridware, lord of the manor of Hamstall Ridware. The junior branch of the Cotton family descended from Agnes de Ridware adopted the armorials of Ridware (Azure, an eagle displayed argent) in lieu of their paternal arms of Cotton, which junior branch included Sir Robert Cotton, 1st Baronet (1570–1631) of Conington in Huntingdonshire, founder of the Cottonian Library. These are the pinna (outer ear flaps), temporal (on their temples) Cats communicate for a variety of reasons, including to show happiness, express anger, solicit attention, and observe potential prey. Cats can socialize with each other and are known to form "social ladders", where a dominant cat leads a few lesser cats. As such, cat communication methods have been significantly altered by domestication. They rarely meow to communicate with fellow cats or other animals. When cats communicate with humans, they do so to get what they need or want, such as food, water, attention, or play. Studies have shown that domestic cats tend to meow much more than feral cats. Geisel was asked to write a more entertaining primer by William Spaulding, whom he had met during World War II and who was then director of the education division at Houghton Mifflin. However, because Geisel was already under contract with Random House, the two publishers agreed to a deal: Houghton Mifflin published the education edition, which was sold to schools, and Random House published the trade edition, which was sold in bookstores.
