Analytical chemistry Separation isolates analytes. Qualitative analysis identifies analytes, while quantitative analysis determines the numerical amount or concentration. Equivalent weight An example is the volumetric standardisation In chemistry, equivalent weight (more precisely, equivalent mass) is the mass of one equivalent, that is the mass of a given substance which will combine with or displace a fixed quantity of another substance. The equivalent weight of an element is the mass which combines with or displaces 1. 5 grams of chlorine. The corresponding unit of measurement is sometimes expressed as "gram equivalent". 0 grams of oxygen or 35. 008 gram of hydrogen or 8. analytical chemistry, compounds with higher equivalent weights are generally more desirable because weighing errors are reduced 6a8e19682b

The equivalent weight of an element is the mass of a mole of the element divided by the element's valence. That is, in grams, the atomic weight of the element divided by the usual

valence. For example, the equivalent weight of oxygen is $16.0/2 = 8.0$ grams.

Water content It can be given on a volumetric or gravimetric (mass) basis. Volumetric water content, θ , is defined mathematically as: θ Water content or moisture content is the quantity of water contained in a material, such as soil (called soil moisture), rock, ceramics, crops, or wood. materials' porosity at saturation. It is expressed as a ratio, which can range from 0 (completely dry) to the value of the materials' porosity at saturation. It can be given on a volumetric or gravimetric (mass) basis. Water content is used in a wide range of scientific and technical areas

producing synthetic rubber, which he undertook under the U.S. synthetic rubber program during World War II.
