Bacterial motility Most rod-shaped bacteria can move using their own power, which allows colonization of new environments and discovery of new resources for survival. Most motility mechanisms that evolved among bacteria also evolved in parallel among the archaea. Bacterial movement depends not only on the characteristics of the medium, but also on the use of different appendages to propel. Whereas swarming is a multicellular 2D movement over a surface and requires the presence of surfactants, swimming is movement of individual cells in liquid environments. Swarming and swimming movements are both powered by rotating flagella.
