fundamental personality types: sanguine, choleric, melancholic, and phlegmatic. Greek physician Hippocrates (c. dissertation *De temperamentis*, and searched for physiological reasons for different behaviours in humans. 370 BC) described the four temperaments as part of the ancient medical concept of humourism, that four bodily fluids affect human personality traits and behaviours. Most formulations include the possibility of mixtures among the types where an individual's personality types overlap and they share two or more temperaments. Modern medical science does not define a fixed relationship between internal secretions and personality, although some psychological personality type systems use categories similar to the Greek temperaments. 460 – c 2f1a493cfd
