History of biology Although the concept of biology as a single coherent field arose in the 19th century, the biological sciences emerged from traditions of medicine and natural history reaching back to Ayurveda, ancient Egyptian medicine and the works of Aristotle, Theophrastus and Galen in the ancient Greco-Roman world. During sexual reproduction, a male and a female gamete fuse to form a zygote, which develops into an offspring that inherits traits from each parent. specialized haploid sex cells called gametes via meiosis, each of which has a single set of chromosomes. By convention, organisms that produce smaller, more mobile gametes (spermatozoa, sperm) are called male, while organisms that produce larger, non-mobile gametes (ova, often called egg cells) are called female. Corn smut maydis may assist Corn smut is a plant disease caused by the pathogenic fungus *Mycosarcoma maydis*, synonym *Ustilago maydis*. These observations suggest that recombinational repair during mitosis and meiosis in *M. The infected corn is edible; in Mexico, it is considered a delicacy, called huitlacoche, often eaten as a filling in quesadillas and other tortilla-based dishes, as well as in soups.
