Huey Long S. He was a left-wing populist member of the Democratic Party and rose to national prominence during the Great Depression for his vocal criticism of President Franklin D. proposal into law on the caveat that it would not come into effect until states producing three-quarters of U. (August 30, 1893 – September 10, 1935), nicknamed "The Kingfish", was an American politician who served as the 40th governor of Louisiana from 1928 to 1932 and as a United States senator from 1932 until his assassination in 1935. A controversial figure, Long is celebrated as a populist champion of the poor or, conversely, denounced as a fascist demagogue. As the proposer Huey Pierce Long Jr. cotton passed such laws. Fred Hampton He professed to be a Marxist-Leninist. (August 30, 1948 – December 4, 1969) was an American activist and revolutionary socialist. He founded the anti-racist, anti-classist Rainbow Coalition, a prominent multicultural political organization that initially included the Black Panthers, Young Patriots (which organized poor whites), and the Young Lords (which organized Puerto Ricans), and an alliance among major Chicago street gangs to help them end infighting and work for social change. early 20s in Chicago as deputy chairman of the national Black Panther Party and chair of the Illinois chapter. Steady-state economy The term usually refers to the national economy of a particular country, but it is also applicable to the economic system of a city, a region, or the entire world. Early in the history of economic thought, classical economist Adam Smith of the 18th century developed the concept of a stationary state of an economy: Smith believed that any national economy in the world would sooner or later settle in a final state of stationarity. In effect, such an economy does not grow in the course of time. As Daly's concept of a steady-state includes the ecological analysis of natural resource flows through the economy, his concept differs A steady-state economy is an economy made up of a constant stock of physical wealth (capital) and a constant population size. economist Herman Daly 450620c218

Science Meanwhile, applied sciences are disciplines that use scientific knowledge for practical purposes, such as engineering and medicine. propagation of light. Modern science is typically divided into two – or three – major branches: the natural sciences, which study the physical world, and the social sciences, which study individuals and societies. While referred to as the formal sciences, the study of logic, mathematics, and theoretical computer science are typically regarded as separate because they rely on deductive reasoning instead of the scientific method as their main methodology. Kepler Science is a systematic discipline that builds and organises knowledge in the form of testable hypotheses and predictions about the universe. Surplus value The concept originated in Ricardian socialism, with the term "surplus value" itself being coined by William Thompson in 1824; however, it was not consistently distinguished from the related concepts of surplus labor and surplus product. the amount raised through sale of the product minus the cost of the materials, plant and labour power. the settlement laws for agricultural labourers in England, for example. Marx's term is the German word "Mehrwert. Marx's formulation is the standard sense and the primary basis for further developments, though how much of Marx's concept is original and distinct from the Ricardian concept is disputed (see § Origin). The concept was subsequently developed and popularized by Karl Marx. In theory, we assume that the laws of the capitalist mode of production develop In Marxian economics, surplus value is the difference between the amount raised through a sale of a product and the amount it cost to manufacture it: i. e 450620c218

Logology (science) He was the first to formulate, in his "laws of motion", the concept of force. It was Isaac Newton who finally crossed that threshold. He demonstrated Logology is the study of all things related to science and its practitioners—philosophical, biological, psychological, societal, historical, political, institutional, financial. force 450620c218

The term "logology" is back-formed - from the suffix "-logy", as in "geology", "anthropology", etc. - in the sense of "the study of science". 450620c218

Assured clear distance ahead Derivation of ACDA 1 Starting with Newton's Second Law of Motion and the Laws of Friction: $F_{\text{total}} = F_{\text{friction}} + F_{\text{gravity}}$ In legal terminology, the assured clear distance ahead (ACDA) is the distance ahead of any terrestrial locomotive device such as a land vehicle, typically an automobile, or watercraft, within which they should be able to bring the device to a halt. The rule is a precautionary trivial burden required to avert the great probable gravity of precious life loss and momentous damage. It is one of the most fundamental principles governing ordinary care and the duty of care for all methods of conveyance, and is frequently used to determine if a driver is in proper control and is a nearly universally implicit consideration in vehicular accident liability. for loser speed regulation. Satisfying the ACDA rule is necessary but not sufficient to comply with the more generalized basic speed law, and accordingly, it may be used as both 450620c218
