Character creation It may also include informal descriptions of the character's physical appearance, personality, personal back-story ("background"), and possessions. Character creation is the first step taken by the players (as opposed to the gamemaster) in preparation for a game. This may include a representation of the character's physical, mental, psychological, and social attributes and skills in terms of the specific game's mechanics. Games with a fantasy setting may include traits such as race, class, or species.
