Google Answers This service involved Google staffers answering questions by e-mail for a flat fee. Google Answers was an online knowledge market offered by Google, active from April 2002 until December 2006. Its predecessor was Google Questions and Answers, which was launched in June 2001.

Some Answered Questions The book was first published in English in 1908.
