Domestication of the dog The dog's similarity to the grey wolf is the result of substantial dog-into-wolf gene flow, with the modern grey wolf being the dog's nearest living relative. Genetic studies suggest that all ancient and modern dogs share a common ancestry, descending from an ancient, now-extinct wolf population - or closely related wolf populations - which was distinct from the modern wolf lineage. There were some wolves that were related to all ancient The domestication of the dog was the process which resulted in the emergence of the domestic dog as a species (*Canis familiaris*). This included the dog's genetic divergence from the wolf, its domestication, and the emergence of the first dogs. almost negligible gene flow from wolves into dogs but substantial gene flow from dogs into wolves. Species reintroduction is the deliberate release of a species into the wild, from captivity or other areas where the organism is capable of survival. The goal of species reintroduction is to establish a healthy, genetically diverse, self-sustaining population to an area where it has been extirpated, or to augment an existing population. Because reintroduction may involve returning native species to localities where they had been extirpated, some prefer the term "reestablishment". Species that may be eligible for reintroduction are typically threatened or endangered in the wild. Wolf reintroduction This process often comes with conflict from parties who may oppose wolf reintroduction, and efforts are often large public issues.
