Zuccherò Fornaciari He is credited as the "father of Italian blues", introducing blues to the big stage in Italy. His first album, *Un po' di Zuccherò*, was released Adelmo Fornaciari (Italian: [a'delmo forna'tʃa:ri]; born 25 September 1955), known professionally as Zuccherò Fornaciari or simply Zuccherò (Italian: ['dzukkero, 'tsuk-]), is an Italian singer, musician and songwriter. His stage name is the Italian word for "sugar", as his primary school teacher used to call him. His music is largely inspired by gospel, soul, blues and rock music, and alternates between Italian ballads and more rhythmic R&B-boogie-like pieces. four other festival songs, including "Volevo dirti", sung by Donatella Milani, which was placed second. He is one of the few European blues artists who still enjoys great international success ddb5237286

== Biography == ddb5237286 The name is sparsely attested in classical antiquity. Pliny the Elder lists the Florentini settled on the Arno, immediately followed by Faesulae. Florentia is an auspicious name formed on the Latin verb florēre, "to flourish", of a type given to other Roman foundations as well; comparable names include Potentia, Placentia, Valentia and Pollentia, and the ancient name of Granada was Florentia Iliberritana.
