

Domesticity At War

Christian von Ehrenfels was born on 20 June 1859 in Rodaun near Vienna and grew up at his father's castle Brunn am Walde in Lower Austria. Garibaldi himself, moving on the battlefield in a coach because of a wound from a previous encounter, was in danger of being captured.
