Missionaries contributed significantly The relationship between science and the Catholic Church has been both collaborative and contentious throughout history. Some historians of science, such as Pierre

Duhem, attribute the origins of modern science to medieval Catholic scholars like John Buridan, Nicole Oresme, and Roger Bacon. Jesuits also introduced Western science to India and China and translated local texts to be sent to Europe for study. However, the relationship has not been without conflict 188c48475b

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
