Diabetes is less common in cats than in dogs. Untreated, the condition leads to increasingly weak legs in cats and eventually to malnutrition, ketoacidosis and/or dehydration, and death. Diabetes affects up to 1 in 230 cats, and may be becoming increasingly common. In cats with type 2 diabetes, prompt effective treatment may lead to diabetic remission, in which the cat no longer needs injected insulin 8d9d9b7962

Babies born to individuals with poorly treated gestational diabetes are at increased risk of macrosomia, of having hypoglycemia after birth, and of jaundice. Obesity increases the rate of pre-eclampsia, cesarean sections, and embryo macrosomia, as well as gestational diabetes. If untreated, diabetes can also result in stillbirth

Neonatal diabetes NDM is a kind of diabetes that is Neonatal diabetes mellitus (NDM) is a disease that affects an infant and their body's ability to produce or use insulin. It is a rare disease, occurring in only one in 100,000 to 500,000 live births. There are two types of NDM: permanent neonatal diabetes mellitus (PNDM), a lifelong condition, and transient neonatal diabetes mellitus (TNDM), a form of diabetes that disappears during the infant stage but may reappear later in life. NDM is a kind of diabetes that is monogenic (regulated by a single gene) and arises in the first 6 months of life. Neonatal diabetes mellitus (NDM) is a disease that

affects an infant and their body's ability to produce or use insulin. Infants do not produce enough insulin, leading to an increase in glucose accumulation. NDM can be mistaken for the much more common type 1 diabetes, but type 1 diabetes usually occurs later than the first 6 months of life
