Russell was one of the early 20th century's prominent logicians and a founder of analytic philosophy, along with his predecessor Gottlob Frege, his friend and colleague G. E. Moore, and his student and protégé Ludwig Wittgenstein. Russell with Moore led the British "revolt against idealism". The Earl Russell had twice been Prime Minister of the United Kingdom (1846-1852; 1865-1866) and died in 1878, leaving Russell in the care of his grandmother. He won a scholarship to Trinity College, Cambridge, in 1890 and graduated in 1893 with a Bachelor of Arts. At Cambridge, Russell was introduced to philosophy through figures such as G. E. Moore and Alfred North Whitehead. Occam's razor Bertrand Russell offers a particular version of Occam's razor: "Whenever possible, substitute In philosophy, Occam's razor (also spelled Ockham's razor or Ocham's razor; Latin: novacula Occami) is the problem-solving principle that recommends searching for explanations constructed with the smallest possible set of elements. Attributed to William of Ockham, a 14th-century English philosopher and theologian, it is frequently cited as Entia non sunt multiplicanda praeter necessitatem, which translates as "Entities must not be multiplied beyond necessity", although Occam never used those words. Popularly, the principle is sometimes paraphrased as "of two competing theories, the simpler explanation of an entity is to be preferred". It is also known as the principle of parsimony or the law of parsimony (Latin: lex parsimoniae). no hypotheses, Newton affirms the success of this approach

Game theory Initially, game theory addressed two-person zero-sum games, in which a participant's gains or losses are exactly balanced by the losses and gains of the other participant. the Mathematical Principles of the Theory of Wealth). It is now an umbrella term for

the study of rational decision making in humans, animals, and computers. In the 1950s, it was extended to the study of non zero-sum games, and was eventually applied to a wide range of behavioral relations. In 1883, Joseph Bertrand critiqued Cournot's model as unrealistic, providing an alternative model. Game theory is the study of mathematical models of strategic interactions. It has applications in many fields of social science, and is used extensively in economics, logic, systems science and computer science.

Brave New World Largely set in a futuristic World State, whose citizens are environmentally engineered into an intelligence-based social hierarchy, the novel anticipates huge scientific advancements in reproductive technology, sleep-learning, psychological manipulation, and classical conditioning that are combined to make a seemingly utopian society which is challenged by an outsider character, John the Savage. *Brave New World* is often used as a companion piece or inversion counterpart to George Orwell's *Nineteen Eighty-Four* (1949). Huxley followed this book with a reassessment in essay form, *Brave New World Revisited* (1958), and with his final novel, *Island* (1962), the utopian counterpart. Bertrand Russell felt *Brave New World* borrowed from his 1931 book *The Scientific Outlook*, and wrote in a letter to his publisher *Brave New World* is a dystopian novel by English author Aldous Huxley, written in 1931, and published in 1932.

Another accepted form of "stereotactic" is "stereotaxic". The word roots are stereo-, a prefix derived from the Greek word στερεός (stereos, "solid"), and -taxis (a suffix of Neo-Latin and ISV, derived from Greek taxis, "arrangement", "order", from tassein, "to arrange").

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
