Mathematical statistics are proven to be the most powerful tests through methods such as the Neyman–Pearson lemma and the Likelihood-ratio test. Specific mathematical techniques that are commonly used in statistics include mathematical analysis, linear algebra, stochastic analysis, differential equations, and measure theory. Another justification for the use Mathematical statistics is the application of probability theory and other mathematical concepts to statistics, as opposed to techniques for collecting statistical data

Bayes' theorem $P(A|B) = \frac{P(A \cap B)}{P(B)}$, if $P(B) \neq 0$, where $P(A \cap B)$ gives a mathematical rule for inverting conditional probabilities, allowing one to find the probability of a cause given its effect. The theorem was developed in the 18th century by Bayes and independently by Pierre-Simon Laplace. For example, with Bayes' theorem one can calculate the probability that a patient has a disease given that they tested positive for that disease, using the probability that the test yields a positive result when the disease is present

Integers can be considered either in themselves or as solutions to equations (Diophantine geometry). Questions in number theory can often be understood through the study of analytical objects, such as the Riemann zeta function, that encode properties of the integers, primes or other number-theoretic objects in some fashion (analytic number theory). One may also study real numbers in relation to rational numbers, as for instance how irrational numbers...

Intuitively, the larger this weighted distance, the less likely it is that the constraint is true

Together with the Lagrange multiplier test and the likelihood-ratio test, the Wald test is one of three classical approaches to hypothesis testing. Bell's theorem $a_0b_0 + a_0b_1 + a_1b_0 - a_1b_1 = (a_0 + a_1)b_0 + (a_0 - a_1)b_1$. The first such result was introduced by John Stewart Bell in 1964, building upon the Einstein–Podolsky–Rosen paradox, which had called attention to the phenomenon of quantum entanglement. Bell's theorem is a term encompassing a number of closely related results in physics, all of which determine that quantum mechanics is incompatible with local hidden-variable theories, given some basic assumptions about the nature of measurement

In the context of Bell's theorem, "local" refers to the principle of locality, the idea that a particle can only be influenced by its immediate surroundings, and that interactions mediated by physical fields cannot propagate faster than the speed of light. "Hidden variables" are supposed properties of quantum particles that are not included in quantum theory but nevertheless...
