Rooted in the work of Annemarie Palincsar, this approach aims to improve reading in students using specific reading strategies, such as Questioning, Clarifying, Summarizing, and Predicting, to actively construct meaning from text. groundwork for lifelong learning and academic success.

Extensive reading Though used as a teaching strategy to promote second-language development, ER also applies to free voluntary reading and recreational reading both in and out of the classroom. It stands in contrast to intensive or academic reading, which is focused on a close reading of dense, shorter texts, typically not read for pleasure. ER is based on the assumption that we learn to read by reading. both first- and second-language learners, such as greater grammar and vocabulary knowledge, increase in background knowledge, and greater language confidence Extensive reading (ER) is the process of reading longer, easier texts for an extended period of time without a breakdown of comprehension, feeling overwhelmed, or the need to take breaks.

TOEFL is a trademark of the Educational Testing Service (ETS), a private non-profit organization, which designs and administers the tests. ETS issues official score reports which are sent independently to institutions and are valid for two years following the test. By engaging in dialogue with teachers and peers, students deepen their understanding of text and develop essential literacy skills.

These consequences sometimes include stigmatizing and social exclusion. It is thought to persist as a trait into adult life, with various consequences studied in longitudinal studies of giftedness over the last century. Definitions of giftedness also vary across cultures. There is no generally agreed definition of giftedness for either children or adults, but most school placement decisions and most longitudinal studies over the course of individual lives have followed people with IQs in the top 2. It is a characteristic of children, variously defined, that motivates differences in school programming. 5 percent of the population—that is, IQs above 130.

TPR Storytelling Throughout these three steps, the teacher will use a number of techniques to help make the target language comprehensible to the students, including careful limiting of vocabulary, constant asking of easy comprehension questions, frequent comprehension. with each being regarded as essential for a successful program. There TPR Storytelling (Teaching Proficiency through Reading and Storytelling or TPRS) is a method of teaching foreign languages. The method works in three steps: in step one the new vocabulary structures to be learned are taught using a combination of translation, gestures, and personalized questions; in step two those structures are used in a spoken class story; and finally, in step three, these same structures are used in a class reading. In this step the students are introduced to the new vocabulary phrases for the lesson. TPRS lessons use a mixture of reading and storytelling to help students learn a foreign language in a classroom setting.

Implementation of ER is often referred to as sustained silent reading (SSR) or free voluntary reading; and is used in both the first- (L1) and second-language (L2) classroom to promote reading fluency and comprehension. In... In most US and some Canadian colleges and universities, undergraduates take freshman or higher-level composition courses.
